## All About Disability Pride Month:

Disability Pride Month is the celebration of the passing of the Americans with Disabilities Act in 1990. It is celebrated in the US during the month of July and is a time for those with disabilities of all kinds to come together and *embrace their disabilities as integral parts of who they are, reclaiming visibility in public and interacting fully with their disabilities out in the open, and rejecting shame and internalized ableism. (Source)* 61 million Americans live with some sort of disability, 26% of the total population, and 1 in 3 Americans with a disability do not have access to a regular healthcare provider. (Source) Disability Pride Month is a chance to educate, celebrate and come together to amplify disabled voices and communities. Recognition typically happens at the state level, so check your local sources for events happening in your state.
